Islam is the fastest growing religion - political organization in America so say the news people. It seems that there is Christian apathy everywhere.



October 26. 2025 - Fifteen CMA members attended a Church Visit to West Conroe Baptist Church—ten of those from the Messengers. November 6-11, 2025 - CMA was once again present at the Lone Star Rally in Galveston, TX, shining the light of the Gospel to some of the estimated 400,000-500,000 attendees at the world's largest four-day motorcycle rally. Between 150,000-250,000 motorcycles filled the island as CMA ministered throughout the intense and exciting weekend.

Joy and I arrived on November 5 and enjoyed supper with the CMA team staying at the Beachside Baptist Church facility. It was a blessing to reconnect with long-time friends and meet new ones. Unfortunately, on November 6, I became the first "LSR casualty" after a run-in with the corner of a metal bed frame resulted in a broken rib and a trip to the Galveston ER. Joy and I were very disappointed to miss participating in the rally's ministry this year. A special thank-you to Jimmy Magruirk for driving us to and from the hospital and for riding my Goldwing back to Conroe.

November 15, 2025 - Ten CMA Conroe Messengers and several members of the CMA Shepherds of Steel joined together at the Rally Point Ministries of Texas, held at The Woodlands Community Church of the Nazarene, for their Veterans Day Celebration. Although attendance was smaller than expected, it was a meaningful day of meeting new people and praying with several attendees. A family from Karastan—living in the apartments next door—came over to the event. Joy recognized them from years ago in Aberdeen, Scotland, when our paths crossed overseas. We prayed with them and for their bikes. They shared that they are Russian Orthodox and traditionally only their priest prays for them or blesses their bikes. We pray for another opportunity to meet with them again and share the Gospel.



Road Captain's Motorcycle Maintenance Tips

Last month we talked about the motorcycle maintenance checklist, this month let's look at what a schedule of maintenance is.

UNDERSTANDING MOTORCYCLE MAINTENANCE

When it comes to motorcycle maintenance tips, it's hard to give general advice as motorcycles and mileage vary just as much as their riders. However, understanding the very basics can help you form your own idea about your bike's maintenance. In addition to checking the seven points mentioned above, it's always good to keep an eye on how the bike sounds and feels when you ride.

Here are some pointers to watch out for:

- 1. **SOUND** Does your bike sound different than before? Can you hear a rattle that wasn't there before? Is your exhaust sounding different, or is it getting hotter than before? Problems like this may indicate carburetor issues or, if your bike is fuelinjected, it may show other problems like sticking valves, cam chains getting loose, or it could be old bearings. When your motorcycle starts making weird sounds, it's time to go for a checkup.
- 2. POWER Is your bike suddenly slower to accelerate? Do you feel there is throttle delay? If you start feeling that your bike is running differently, that might be an indicator of bigger problems. Your bike might be running too rich or too lean, there ADDITIONAL MOTORCYCLE CARE may be carburetor issues, or your throttle cable may be loose. 

History of CMA

The original brainstorm for such an organization occurred in 1972 when Herb Shreve and his teenage son purchased their first motorcycles. It was not until 1974 when the need for a new organization began to be realized. Herb attended his first motorcycle rally and saw a massive crowd of motorcyclists who did not know Jesus Christ as their personal Savior. In fact, many had never heard the Gospel message.

The realization of such a great need prompted Herb to share his vision with a couple of Christian friends. Together, they began to pray. Herb became more and more convinced that God wanted a Christian organization dedicated to reaching motorcyclists with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the spring of 1975, he put action to his prayers. An attorney was contacted, and a nonprofit charter was applied for and approved. The waiting was over. The Christian Motorcyclists Association (CMA) was born.
