Answer:

The first Christmas gifts actually were given shortly after Jesus' birth, when a group of wise men from another country sought out the young child and His family. When they found Him, the Bible says, "they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh" (Matthew 2:11).

Since then, people have often given each other gifts to celebrate the joy of Christ's coming into the world. We don't give gifts or offerings directly to Him; however, the way we might give a gift to someone on their birthday — for we don't need to try to win His favor or buy His friendship. Instead, we give gifts to others to let them know we love them and value their friendship. Hopefully, our gifts will also remind them of that first Christmas.

Most of all, as we give gifts at Christmas, we should remember the greatest gift of all — the gift that God gave us by sending His Son into the world. We are separated from God because of our sin — but God sent His Son into the world to take away our sins and offer us the gift of His salvation. We don't deserve it — but God in His love offers it to us anyway.

Like any other gift; however, it must be received. By faith reach out and receive the gift of Jesus Christ into your life today. Then you'll be able to say, "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15).

OUR HELP IS FROM THE LORD PSALM 121

Christians have long found solace and reason for courage and hope in the words of this psalm. We live in a fallen world, a world full of trouble and danger. Protection is needed for traveling through this dangerous territory. Notice how the psalmist coaches himself-talking to himself and reminding himself of the truth of God's Word. He identifies the source of this help as the Creator, "the LORD, who made heaven and earth." He reasons that since God is the Creator, he is also the sovereign ruler over all. We need to follow this example of reasoning and working out the truth in our minds.

Because He is personally involved in both the mundane and the significant things in our lives, God knows the difficulties that we face. He is able to keep us safe from anything that would do us real and lasting harm. Our Lord not only helps us with immediate concerns; he also ensures that we will endure to the end (Phil. 1:6).

We are not promised that our lives will be free of hardships and tragedies. In fact, Jesus told us that we will have trouble in the world (John 16:33). His enemies are our enemies. A biblical perspective on life demands that we acknowledge this reality: trouble, difficulty, and hardship are the norm, not the exception. And yet, God promises that he is always with us (Matt. 28:20; Heb. 13:5).

All earthly sources of help have limitations. None is worthy of our devotion or ultimate dependence. So it ought to be our greatest comfort in trouble or danger to know that God's loving eye is always upon us-that he is our Keeper. He is not distant, distracted, disinterested, or deficient.

God will never fail to help you. He cannot fail. Our utterly powerful, wise, and loving helper is the Lord Almighty. He is our faithful guardian. It is good to foster a sense of gratitude for God's help and for the knowledge that he stays close to us and guards our lives. Praise him for his kind and faithful help!


Psalm 121 provides a paradigm for life's journey. Lift up your eyes to the one and only sure source of help. The Lord hears the prayers of his people and is ready to answer in ways that will showcase his glory and shape us into the likeness of his Son. No trouble, no loss, no hardship, no disaster will do us ultimate harm. Walk

in step with God's Spirit as he directs your going out and your coming in, so that all things mold you into the likeness of Christ and increase your joy in him "The Lord will keep you from all evil" (Ps. 121:7). Devotional

The DNA of the Faithful

What does it mean to be truly faithful? What does it look like to be a faithful minister of the gospel—a spiritual gold medalist in the race set before us?

Scripture makes it clear: the first and foremost mark of faithfulness is this—teach the truth.

When Paul wrote to Timothy, his son in the faith, he emphasized this calling again and again. The letters of First and Second Timothy, along with Titus, are often called the *pastoral epistles* because they provide God's direct instruction to His shepherds. While seminaries may train pastors in languages, theology, and church history, these epistles are the *God-breathed manual* for ministry. They are not to be judged by our institutions—rather, they must be the standard by which every ministry is measured.

If Paul were asked to name the foremost duty of a faithful minister, his answer would be unmistakable: *teach the truth of God's Word*. By frequency and emphasis, this command rises above all else. A faithful servant of Christ—whether pastor, parent, spouse, friend, or evangelist—must be saturated with Scripture. God's Word must dwell richly within, flowing out in speech, in counsel, and in love. Faithfulness is not defined by personality, charm, or even presence. Faithfulness is defined by speaking the very words of God.

We may ask: is not our love itself a power that changes lives? The Word of God gives us the answer—no. Love in itself is not the power of transformation. Rather, love prepares the soil of the heart to receive the seed of truth, for it is the Word that carries divine power. As Romans 1:16 declares: "The gospel is the power of God unto salvation to everyone who believes."

Consider this picture: in a car, gasoline provides the power to move forward. But that power cannot be accessed without a key to unlock the door and turn the ignition. In the same way, truth is the power—the fuel. Love is the key that opens the way for truth to be heard and received. One without the other leaves us stranded. Truth without love is like giving someone a car full of gas, but with the doors locked. Love without truth is like handing over the keys to an empty tank. Both are essential, each serving its God-ordained purpose.

Therefore, we are to be both loving and truthful. Connecting to the source of truth and presenting it in love is the formula. The power is in the Gospel, the transmission is through personal relationships, and the result is Glory to God, the Father. This is why we do what we do for Christ!

1-11.4 oz. bag of M&M's.

1-16 oz. bag of Snyder Snaps Pretzels

1-8 oz. pouch of Rolo Minis

- 1. Preheat oven to 225-degrees.
- 2. Spread the Snyder Snaps Pretzels out on a cookie sheet.
- 3. Sprinkle the Andes Baking Chips on top of half of the pretzels.
