But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.


Romans 8:39



Story of Impact: Delivering a Motorcycle on the Amazon River

Getting a motorcycle to pastors is a huge blessing but sometimes it can be a little tricky to get that bike where it needs to be! Can you imagine taking a motorcycle from the mouth of the Amazon basin and boating it up the Amazon river in order to get it to a village to present it to the pastor? Taking a motorcycle & cart down a steep incline of wooden stairs, across a wide board on the water, onto a river dock, and lifting it on the tip of a river boat is exactly what one CMA team did!

The bike was tied down as the boat went up the Amazon River until the team landed on a rocky, muddy shore. The bike was then carried up the slippery bank carried by CMA'ers and locals a few feet at a time until there was enough grass to roll the bike to the top of the bank.

That amazing motorcycle rolled into the church and was presented to an excited pastor! The ministry and the bike were prayed over and blessed. Now it's a tool to help spread the gospel and care for the village people!

"We carried the motorcycle, now the motorcycle will carry the gospel!"

Each year, CMA collects funds through Run for the Son to help provide tools to support ministries around the globe to share the gospel message. Over the past 38 years, Run for the Son has played an important role in 41.7 million salvations in 194 countries around the globe. Your contributions are impacting the world for Christ!

Road Captain's Tips: Helmets by Russell Rhodes

Let's talk about motorcycle helmets today. I actually talked about this 2 years back and got some interesting feedback. Let's see what others say in 2026.

You can argue that the most critical piece of safety gear when riding a motorcycle is the helmet. There are many different types of helmets on the market, all of which keep you safer than not wearing one at all. There are 6 primary types of motorcycle helmets. These are:

- Full-Face
- Modular
- Open-Face (3/4)
- Half Helmets
- Off-Road, and
- Dual Sport

Full-face helmets offer the most coverage around your head and neck. As a result, it is considered the safest type of motorcycle helmet to protect you from potential impact. A full-face helmet is a versatile choice for all riders, regardless of the type of motorcycle you ride or where you ride it. A full-face helmet varies depending on the riding that you do. Sports riders have a crouched riding position and need a helmet that doesn't lift at high speeds. Therefore, they usually opt for a helmet with a higher chin bar, and a visor opening angled slightly towards the top of the helmet.

Modular helmets, also known as flip-up helmets, are a mix between a 3/4 helmet and a full-face helmet. The reason is that the chin bar and visor can flip up to open the front of the helmet.

Open-face helmets, also known as 3/4 helmets, cover your head's top back and sides but leave your face exposed. They are popular amongst scooters, cafe racers, tourers, and cruisers, as the face area is kept open to feel the wind on their skin. The distinguishing feature of a 3/4 helmet is the lack of a chin bar, which significantly reduces the safety of the motorcycle helmet.

Half helmets only cover the top of your head and the area from your forehead to your brows and provide minimal protection. Some may offer a bit more coverage on the back of your neck and ears, but leaves the rest of your face exposed. Although these helmets provide excellent airflow, they offer significantly less protection than a full face or 3/4 helmet. That said, you can still find half-helmets that are DOT-approved.

Off-road helmets are designed just as their name suggests, to ride away from the streets and on dirt roads. They aren't the best option for city and highway use but are ideal for places requiring knobby tires. Off-road helmets usually do not offer eye protection, so riders should be prepared to ride with glasses or goggles. If you're riding in dirt or mud, goggles will be the preference as they can seal against the rider's face to prevent debris intrusion while riding.

Dual-sport helmets are a mix between an off-road helmet and a full-face helmet.

6 ROMANTIC VALENTINE'S DAY IDEAS FOR BIKERS

Valentine's Day is right around the corner. As a biker, this is your chance to pull out all the stops to impress your special someone. Make things romantic by having a memorable ride with your heartthrob, or surprise them by using your motorcycle to add some flair to your usual Valentine's traditions.

1. Make a Special Delivery - Buy a bouquet of roses, box of chocolates, or Valentine's cards and deliver them to your significant other while riding on your motorcycle. It's a smooth move when you give them these valentines yourself.

2. Scenic Cycling - Roll out on your motorcycle and escape to a scenic destination. Ride to the mountains and see views at an overlook, and count the stars together in the evening. Bike to the beach and watch a sunrise or sunset. Come nightfall, see the city lights while riding on your motorcycle.

3. Date Night - Put on your best riding jacket and go out for a date night. Pick them up at their place and try a new restaurant or a familiar favorite. Saddle up together on your bike and have a night out on the town as you cruise into the movies, a concert, or performance at a theater.

4. Pack a Picnic - This is a gesture that shows your affection while spending time together outside and leaving your worries behind. Bring a basket on your bike, hit the highway, and find a cozy spot to picnic. You can lay out a blanket, maybe even spread out flowers, and share the picnic food they love most.

5. Get Dirty Off-Roading - If you've got a couple dirt bikes, this is a fun way to get down and dirty on Valentine's Day; whether you're riding through puddles or slinging around some mud, this is guaranteed to be a date they'll remember. Show off your biking skills with stunts and tricks while you have a playful off-road adventure.

6. Teach Them to Ride - Get close to the one you care about while letting them in on the other love of your life—your motorcycle. Share more on the experience of riding with a lesson alone together. Provide a tour of your motorcycle and each of its parts, give them all the safety gear and riding attire they may need, then go for a ride together. Maybe even surprise him or her with some gear especially made for them.

Spread the love around and make your motorcycle part of the romance this Valentine's Day.

Dual-sport helmets offer a larger eye protection visor than a full face, but they can also snap into an up position for the use of goggles. The visor is aerodynamic; therefore, it does not lift in the wind like an off-road helmet. In addition, the chin bar is not as obtrusive as an off-road helmet, so there is better soundproofing and not as much airflow.

Heart Health by Joy Booher

As you step into this new year of 2026, are you focusing on taking steps to maintain or develop a healthy lifestyle? An applicable quote that I read this week was "A healthy heart is your greatest wealth." The National Institute of Health posted, "Self care is not selfish; when we take care of our heart, we reduce the risk of heart disease and set an example for those around us to do the same." This startling claim followed: "Heart disease is a food-borne illness." We are further encouraged to follow a course of GOOD NUTRITION, EXERCISE, and STRESS MANAGEMENT, and admonished that **"Healthy habits lead to a healthy heart tomorrow."**

If I've ever chatted with you about my dad's sisters, I will have mentioned that Aunt Eleanor celebrated her 100 birthday and my Aunt Kathleen reached 99 before they went home to heaven. My youngest aunt Lorraine of 83 years is the only one of my 7 aunts that suffered a heart attack. I asked her what she is doing now to stay heart healthy. Here's what she wrote about adapting her habits and perspective for a healthy heart:

Physically: walking, I love to, but haven't been able to just now with Canada's harsh winter and ice underfoot. Eating, less at a time and more often. Napping, I'm a big fan of an afternoon nap, as I tire easily. **Spiritually:** 2 Corinthians 1:9 "Indeed, we *felt* we *had* received the sentence of death. But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves, but on God, who raises the dead."

John Krohn, a former pastor, has faced challenges including homelessness for his family of 4, and loss of income due to care-giving for the other 3. Now he's having tests to see if cancer has returned to his body. In the midst of these trying circumstances, he finds God's word holds him fast. He feeds on it, and calls it a "buffet of blessings" and "a rich banquet."

He quotes Aristotle, **"Love is composed of a single soul inhabiting 2 bodies."** Followed by John's own words: "One heart... God's heart beating spiritually within our soul, His temple. Syncing with His heartbeat until there is only one."

John's favorite heart health verses are Psalm 139:23-24: "Search me, Oh God, and know my heart; put me to the test and know my anxious thoughts; And see if there is any hurtful way in me, And lead me in the way everlasting."

History of CMA

The original brainstorm for such an organization occurred in 1972 when Herb Shreve and his teenage son purchased their first motorcycles. It was not until 1974 when the need for a new organization began to be realized. Herb attended his first motorcycle rally and saw a massive crowd of motorcyclists who did not know Jesus Christ as their personal Savior. In fact, many had never heard the Gospel message.

The realization of such a great need prompted Herb to share his vision with a couple of Christian friends. Together, they began to pray. Herb became more and more convinced that God wanted a Christian organization dedicated to reaching motorcyclists with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the spring of 1975, he put action to his prayers. An attorney was contacted, and a nonprofit charter was applied for and approved. The waiting was over. The Christian Motorcyclists Association (CMA) was born.
